Brief History

Henry Hartzold was born about 1862 in Lancaster, PA. He moved to McLean County in 1894, becoming a prominent farmer in Dry Grove township near Danvers. He and his wife, Mary Rengel Hartzold, had four children—Eugene, Lorretta, Edward J., and Helen. Eugene died at a young age. Hartzold's son, Edward, farmed with him until his death in 1938, at which time Edward took over the farm. Edward and his wife, Ruth Steele Hartzold, had four children—Joseph, Lois, Robert, Richard, and Larry. Joseph was fatally injured in 1952 while in serving in Korea. After Ruth's death, Edward married Lucille Staubus. All are interred in St. Mary's Cemetery. Robert Hartzold took over the farm after Edwards death in 1975.

Scope

The collection includes personal family information; county government allotment production contracts for hogs; sales records to the Bloomington and the Peoria Livestock Producers Commissions; sales records to the Chicago Producers Commission; and a photo album covering Joseph Hartzold in Korea, as well as some photos of Edward Hartzold during World War I.
